WATER PROJECT

Progress has been slow the past few months due to the abundance of snow. A crew began installing new meters this week. As has been mentioned before, there are many residences in Dwight with aging water pipes. This can lead to bad tasting water and costly water leaks. Now would be the time to consider replacing the pipes into your home. City Council is checking into the possibility of Larson Construction installing a shutoff valve on the residence side of the meter for those who do not currently have a shutoff. Each property owner would need to make arrangements with Larson to install the shutoff and would be responsible for payment arrangements with Larson prior to the shutoff being installed. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The City Office has been receiving calls even more frequently in recent weeks inquiring about available properties in Dwight and the outlying areas. Riley is looking for property within 20 miles/ 30 minute commute to the front gates of Ft Riley. More information will be available soon.
