

### DOG REGISTRATIONS

The annual Dog Clinic was held on April 24th. Dog tags expired on April 30th. If you have not registered your dog(s) please contact the City Office to get them registered. Pursuant to Ordinance No. 200D: Any dog over six months of age owned and kept within the city must be annually registered with the City Clerk. A current completed certificate of immunization against rabies is required for registration. A \$25 fine will be assessed if dogs are not registered within 30 days of the dog clinic. A special city council meeting will be held on May 6th, 2021 at 7 PM at the Dwight United Methodist Church. Council members are asking for your input during the discussion regarding ongoing issues with the building (roof, awning, floor joists, bathrooms, mold and finances). ### **ELECTION**



Would you like to be a Council member? The filing deadline is June 1st at noon. Forms are available at the Morris County Courthouse and must be returned back to the courthouse. The requirements to file for a Council position are either \$20.00 or the signatures of five individuals who are registered to vote in Dwight. If needed, a Primary election will be held on August 3rd and the General Election will be held on November 2<sup>nd</sup>. The Mayor and two council seats will be open. If you are not interested in running for office, please vote to make your voice be heard as to who you want to represent you on City Council. You can also write-in a vote to the County Clerk.

### SUMMERFEST 2022

## CITY-WIDE GARAGE SALES

#### CITY-WIDE CLEAN-UP

City-wide clean-up will be held on June 19th, 2021. Volunteers will pick up allowed items that are left on your curb by 8 AM. Clean-up will end by 11:30 AM. There will also be a dumpster available for

residents to dump their items in on Main Street and 6th Street. Items allowed: household items such as old furniture, trash and rubbish, metal appliances, limbs and brush, iron, fence wire, rocks or bricks, tires (4 per residence 17" or smaller) NO home remodel or construction materials, to include but not limited to; decking, fencing, siding will be accepted this year. ITEMS NOT ALLOWED: Dead Animals, ammunition or explosives, gas tanks, asbestos waste, any waste that requires KDHE authorization. If you would like to volunteer to help with cleanup let Heather know. Trucks and trailers are needed to assist with clean-up.

#### **BURN SITE-FRONT STREET**

The City of Dwight holds a permit to burn trees and brush at the burn site at 4th and Front Streets. The permit allows only trees and brush to be burned. Recently major violations have occurred at the burn site. KDHE conducts random inspections at the burn site. If a violation has occurred, they can take the City burn site away. This affects everyone in the City. Please keep an eye out for any violations that might occur. No other waste such as garbage, tires, shingles, or construction materials may be placed at the burn pile. Access to the burn pile is open to any resident who has limbs or brush to dispose of. All you need to do is take it to the burn site and the City will take care of properly burning it.

#### **WEEDS**

Ordinance No. 1102 includes:

1. Weeds and grasses on or about residential property which, because of its height, has a blighting effect on the neighborhood. Any such weeds shall be presumed to be blighting if they exceed 8 inches in height.

If the City has to mow your property you will be charged the current rate.

### RECYCLING

The Morris County recycle center in Dwight is located at 541 6<sup>th</sup> Street. Each Thursday, the recycling truck comes to Dwight to collect the items. They accept the following items: newspaper, magazines, phone books, aluminum, tin cans, junk mail, soda bottles, water bottles, juice bottles, clear milk jugs, #2 & #5 colored plastic, and cardboard.



### **WEATHER SAFETY**

The tornado siren in Dwight is controlled by the Morris County Emergency Management. It will go off only when rotation has been sighted or the National Weather Service has issued a Tornado warning for our area. (Or during a drill). Once the siren goes off, you have less than five minutes to take cover. Please take precautions by listening to your radio or television for watches or warnings. A second siren DOES NOT mean all clear – it

means another storm is approaching. You should be prepared with an emergency supply kit. The following is an emergency supply list as recommended by FEMA:

\*WATER-one gallon of water per person, per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation. \*FOOD-at least a three day supply of non-perishable food.

\*BATTERIES-for flashlights, weather radios, etc. \*FIRST AID KIT \*WHISTLE-to signal for help \*HAND-HELD CAN OPENER-for food
