

Dwight City Council Minutes

April 28th, 2026

The Dwight City Council met for a regular meeting at the Dwight Public Library on April 28th, 2026, at 7:00pm. Mayor Pam Goss opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. Other council members present were Ashley Gearhart, Jamie Fetters, Peter Marquardt and John Traynor

Minutes: Councilwoman Gearhart moved to accept the minutes as presented for the March 16th, 2026, regular meeting. Councilwoman Fetters seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0

Maintenance Manager Report: Manager Ryan Taylor provided a written report. Ryan reported damage to sewer lines and provided photos. Estimates were received from Mayer Specialties at \$35,777.02 for lining 727 lf and \$42,700.00 for epoxy lining at the Lift Station. Ryan will coordinate a conference call with Mayer Specialties to further discuss the estimates with the governing body during the May meeting. Grants were discussed for updating the sewer infrastructure.

Water Manager Report: Manager Ryan Taylor provided a written report.

City Clerk Report: Clerk Ken Bergeron provided a written report and financials. Ken reported the delinquent accounts have all have made payments.

Review and Bills: Councilman Marquardt moved to approve the unpaid bills as presented with the addition of Tyner Insurance and Oleen Law Firm. Councilwoman Fetters seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0

New Business: Councilwoman Fetters moved to go into executive session at 8:00pm for an employee review and not to exceed 30 minutes. Councilwoman Gearhart seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0. Councilman Marquardt moved to go back to regular session at 8:14. Councilwoman Gearhart seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0. Councilwoman Fetters moved to increase Ryan's hourly pay to \$20. Councilman Marquardt seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0.

Old Business:

Mayor Goss continues working on the 2026 budget for Council based upon the past five years of income and expenditures. A Vacate Alley Ordinance was discussed and additional information is to be submitted for the next meeting. Dog registrations continue with follow-up letters to be sent to those not yet registered per ordinance No. 200D (Section 10-13).

Open Forum: Pam will coordinate flowers to be planted on main street. Pam will also contact the Fire Dept for help with clearing plugged tubes around town. Amy Marquardt thanked Pam for safely returning a loose dog to his home several weekends ago.

Adjournment: Councilman Marquardt moved to adjourn the regular meeting at 9:15pm. Councilwoman Gearhart seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0. The next regular council meeting will be held on April 18th, at 7pm. Location will be the City Library.
